As an enthusiastic dog owner, I look forward to spending quality time with my Newfoundland. Almost as equally, I enjoy a little sport. I found a perfect union between these two loves within the dog show world. With options like obedience, tracking, agility...there is literally something for everyone. Having little background knowledge of what these activities look like, I chose to speak with friends involved in many different areas of showing and decided to attend a local Dog Show. That is when I found my starting point, conformation.



I began showing my Newfoundland, Bowie, in breed competition. I practiced the weeks and days leading up to the show. However, nothing quite prepared me like being in the ring! During my first few attempts at conformation, I often felt that by the time I got into the ring and figured out what I was doing, it was over. Not to mention feeling completely out-handled by more experienced individuals. I quickly realized that I needed more time in the ring. Several friends suggested I sign-up for the National Owner-Handled Series portion of the show. This would prove to be one of the best decisions I would make on this journey.

As I signed up for the next conformation show, I was pleasantly surprised to see that the NOHS entry was at no additional cost. I looked



forward to having more opportunity practicing in the ring, as well as showing on a more even playing field, as professional handlers are not allowed to show in NOHS. This relieved anxieties and provided confidence at the prospect of having my peers (some of whom are professional handlers) ringside, to observe my handling skills and offer constructive criticism where needed. A win-win situation!



Best Owner-Handled Best of Breed takes place just after regular Best of Breed is selected. The ring steward clears the ring of all professional handlers and calls for all NOHS participants to come back into the ring. In my case, this offered peace of mind as I reentered the ring with

peers whose skillset more closely matched my own, as well as a second chance to move forward in the show. If an owner handled dog wins the regular Best of Breed, they automatically advance to the Owner Handled group. While NOHS is a non-titling competition, you do acquire points. AKC compiles points based on the Best of Breed, Group, and Best in Show placements and dogs are ranked by breed and group nationally, with the top 10 in each breed being invited to the AKC National Owner-Handled Series Dog Show held in December. Most importantly, entering into NOHS adds up to hours of practice and bonding with your dog.

If you are looking for a way to build the bond between you and your furry loved one, I highly recommend entering a conformation show, more specifically, the NOHS portion. Not only will this time sharpen your skillset, it will also benefit the working relationship between you and your beloved partner. While obedience, draft and water training, are excellent options in the dog sport world, these require a much more polished performance. For someone new to this arena, conformation is a great stepping-stone and NOHS offers you the opportunity to refine the art of handling.



TRAINING LARGE DOGS IN SMALL SPACES? NO PROBLEM!

If the rain ever stops and it stays below freezing for more than 15 minutes, I'll be able to walk dogs regularly on the road. Muddy gravel roads and coated dogs are not a good combo! Until then, indoor obedience "doodling" has helped break up the Netflix binges. Fine tuning of little behaviors keeps the dogs thinking and, hopefully, will help our ring performances in the long run. (I can hope!) There is a lot you can do in a little space. Of course, our "little space" still needs to be quite large compared to the "little space" that small dog people need, but you can accomplish a lot in even an average living room. If you can stand with your dog sitting by your side and a) turn around without hitting anything and b) take 4-7 normal steps without hitting anything, the area is big enough. Extended heel patterns (loose leash walking practice, 80-100 steps) will have to be put on hold until the weather improves. It is, however, easy to work sit/stand/down stays, left and right finishes, left/right/about turns, halts, short recalls, signals, retrieve (water equipment and dumbell), backing (draft), harnessing and most Novice Rally signs in the kitchen or garage. Some area groups offer nosework and rally classes, both of which are easily practiced in small areas. Hibernation is not an option! If you want to get started in any dog sport and are confused about where to begin, contact any club officer or Board member. If they can't help you, they can probably find someone who can!


